they intended to stop here
but we have not seen or heard
any thing of them. Think she

will be surprised to see your
ma'am I went over to see
Ada and Corrie this P.M. Saw

going to the ferry with horses
and sleigh so I thought it a
good time for me to go and
then have the ride. I did not
feel equal to it for I can not
come all over and there through
me but I went just the
same and I can tell to some
how I feel from it. Ada just

had to have the doctor. The says
nothing can be done but an
operation. (I told them all
about the Candy business -
