

## THE HAWAIIAN (OR SANDWICH ISLANDS

Were discovered by Captain Cook in 1778.

The integrity of the kingdom was recognized by the United States, France and Great Britain under the reign of Kamehameha III.

In January, 1893, a disagreement between Queen Liliuokalani and her cabinet caused an uprising, which resulted in a provisional government being formed.

On July 4, 1894, a republic was proclaimed, with Sanford B. Dole as president. Agitation among the ruling element for annexation to the United States followed.

On August 12, 1898, the formal transfer of the island to the sovereignty of the United States took place.

The total area of the group is 6,740 square miles; of this 4,210 are in the island of Hawaii, Maui 760, Oahu 600, Kauai 590, Molokai 270, Lanai 150, Niihau 97, Kahoolawe 63.

At the time of the discovery of the islands the population was in the neighborhood of 200,000 natives; these have steadily decreased, as may be seen by table below.

A census taken in 1897 gave a population distributed as follows of 109,020:
